Fact: This myth has probably grown out of confusion between the variety of different living arrangements and kinds of facilities offered under the umbrella of *senior living*. In most independent living communities, such as Westminster Village, you can choose to have an apartment with a full kitchen or kitchenette. Most communities have

dining rooms or an onsite café, or both, but by no means are you are required to take your meals there. There are some communities where rent includes regular meals in a communal dining room. At



Westminster, in our Full Kitchen apartments, you have a choice of a one or three Meal Plan, while the Kitchenette apartments include three meals. At Westminster, if you start out in one of our Full Kitchen apartments with one meal in our dining rooms and later want to switch to a three meal plan, you are welcome to do so.
